UPDATE FROM GARRY ION IN UGANDA

Dear Rod and friends at Holy Apostles,

Sorry it's been a while; I haven't been deported but successfully renewed my Uganda work permit a couple of weeks ago. So it is business as usual, for now! Thank you so much for your prayers on the matter, the process had its twists and turns but was renewed in record time- three weeks from start to finish, instead of the previous three months last time.

Easter found me at my former home, Kiwoko Hospital. It was nice to be amongst new and old friends as we fellowshipped together. It was triple celebrations as we said farewell to Dr Rory Wilson- Medical director, his wife Denise and son Gideon who's seventh birthday we also celebrated. The Wilson's return to Northam Ireland after serving at the hospital for seven years. I will really miss their friendship and Irish hospitality.

Back on the road, I spent the rest of last week in northern Uganda, helping a couple of schools to put up fences. It is sad to see tall chain-link- barbed wire fences go up, but with the huge influx of refugees from South Sudan, both they and local Ugandan communities feel vulnerable.

In South Sudan, the famine has so far not affected the displaced South Sudan communities I serve (most now refugees in Uganda), though conditions remain very uncertain. Further north, again in South Sudan, aid agencies are struggling to reach those affected by the famine. They are cut off due to fighting between government and opposition soldiers. Serval aid workers have been killed. The South Sudan embassy here in Kampala is no longer issuing visas, so even if I wanted to, I can't travel into South Sudan. It's a very sad situation. Next week I drivel back to northern Uganda to meet with more school communities as they plan for the future. I would appreciate your prayers as I go.

BIBLE READING

Ephesians 4:1-16

As a prisoner for the Lord, then, I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received. ² Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. ³ Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace. ⁴ There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; ⁵ one Lord, one faith, one baptism; ⁶ one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

⁷ But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it.⁸ This is why it] says: "When he ascended on high, he took many captives and gave gifts to his people." ⁹ (What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? ¹⁰ He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.) ¹¹ So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹² to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. ¹⁴ Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. ¹⁵ Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶ From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.
